The reason; a series of explosions in the 200-foot elevator tower had rendered the structure unsafe; and families from a dozen homes nearby, around fifty people, were waiting to hear when they would be allowed back home. Of course, their plight belies the grief of workers injured and their families, in one case fatally, who were caught in the explosion.
